## “WATCH, WAIT, AND WONDER® - INTERVENTION

The **Advanced Training** is the next step for participants who have completed the Introductory Course and have used the Intervention with at least one infant/toddler–parent dyad for a minimum of 8 sessions.

This is the last Advanced Training involving Elisabeth Muir. She was pivotal to the development and research of the Intervention. Elisabeth is an outstanding clinician and writer, and a superb clinical supervisor.

The format for an Advanced Course focuses on clinicians presenting case material. Each participant will be presenting to a group of peers and two accredited supervisors. Full details regarding preparation for participation will be sent once your place is confirmed. There are 14 places on the Course.

The Training is designed to provide a safe space and opportunity for discussion of Watch, Wait and Wonder practice. Advanced ideas about the intervention are taught through this process.

The facilitators provide feedback for participants guiding their ongoing therapeutic development using this intervention.

## GOALS OF THE TRAINING

In the course of learning to do Watch, Wait and Wonder® with clinical populations, it is essential that trainees have an opportunity for an in depth exploration of difficulties that inevitably arise.

- **All participants will present clinical material and this is the primary focus of the course**
- **The group process will support clinicians to ask the many questions that arise when implementing the intervention.**
- **There is time for linking theory with clinical practice, formulating and developing skills in this therapeutic intervention**
- **The course provides the space to be curious and to better understand the difficulties of Watching, Waiting and Wondering**
- **Participants will have exposure to all four facilitators over the course of the Training**

**Dr Denise Guy** is a Child Psychiatrist with specialty expertise in Infant Mental Health. She was involved with the Pilot Study of WWW Intervention [1986-7] and has continued clinical use of the intervention since then. She is currently supervising its use in New Zealand and Australia and co-ordinates Australasian Training.

**Elisabeth Muir** is a Child Psychotherapist who worked with children and families for nearly thirty years in New Zealand and Canada. During her time at the Infant and Family Programme at the Hincks Centre, Toronto, Canada. she initiated and was co-principal investigator in research comparing the infant-led intervention Watch, Wait and Wonder and Selma Fraiberg’s Parent-Infant approach. She has published internationally, presented her work and done training workshops in Europe, Canada, United States, and Australia. Elisabeth retired in 2011

**Seonaigh Stevens** has worked in Infant and Child Mental Health for many years. Currently employed as a Child and Adolescent Psychotherapist at Te Whare Marie, the Specialist Maori Mental Health Regional CAMHS for capital and Coast DHB, Wellington. Her clinical work includes using the WWW-Intervention with infants and older children and their families.
